- (a).GUARD OF HONOUR FOR HIS EXCELLENCY, VICE-ADMIRAL GIR HUMPHREY T. WALWYN, K.C.S.I., K.C.M.G., C.B., D.S.O., GOVERNOR OF NEWFOUNDLAND:-
 - 1. His Excellency, The Governor of Newfoundland will inspect 1st. Battalion, The Black Watch (R.H.R.) of Canada, C.A.S.F., at Newfoundland Airport, on 7th. August, 1940.
 - 2."A" Company will furnish the Guard Of Honour and receive His Excellency at 1400 hrs. The Pipe-Band will parade with the Guard.
 - 3. The Guard of Honour will form up in three ranks in line, in open order on the Baseball Field. The Pipe-Band will be on the right flank at an interval of ten paces. Colours not being available no Colour Party will be detailed. The Guard will form up facing the Railroad tracks.

Dress: Service Jacket; Kilt; Skeleton web(no water-bottle or haver-sack); half-hose, flashes, balmoral, short puttees, rifle and bayonet.

C.S.M., P.S.M.s, C.Q.M.S. will carry rifles and bayonets. Officers will carry pistols.
Pipe-Band will parade in Active Service Review Order.

4. Composition of Guard:

Guard Commander: Capt. C. Petch Lieutenant: Lieut. R. E. Miller C.S.M., 2 P.S.M.s, and C.Q.M.S. 96 Rank and File.

The Guard will be formed in two divisions each of sixteen files; each division being sub-divided into two sections. Guard will be sized and equalized as laid down for a Company.

- 5. Posts of Officers: in line. The Commander will be three paces in front of the second file from the right; the Lieutenant three paces in front of the second file from the left. The posts of Warrant Officers and N.C.O.s: in line: Senior will be at the right guide, the next senior, left guide; third senior, right guide of the second division; and junior, left guide of first division.
- 6.Upon the arrival of His Excellency, at the point at which the Salute will be taken, the command will be: "ROYAL SALUTE, PRESENT ARMS"; the Pipe-Band will then play "Garb of Old Gaul". When the Pipe-Band ceases, the commands will be: "SLOPE ARMS, ORDER ARMS". The Guard Commander will accompany His Excellency, walking next to him on the further side from the rank being inspected. During the inspection, the Pipe-Band will play. After the inspection, the ranks will be closed and dressed: the Guard will then slope arms, and march past His Excellency in column of threes, moving to the right flank. The saluting point will be the road intersection twenty-five feet east of the Orderly Room Marquee.

6. CHANNELS OF INFORMATION (continued):

"Communications received have in no way been confined to complaints, but have included ideas to assist in the Conduct of the War.

All ranks, are, therefore, to be informed of the correct procedure for bringing to notice of higher authority any matters whether it be complaint or otherwise.

It is to be impressed on officers and N.C.O.s that it is their duty to give proper attention and careful consideration to all matters brought to their notice by those under their command, and in the case of complaints that the officer or other rank concerned is duly paraded in accordance with Sections 42 and 43 of the Army Act and notes thereto.

Officers and other ranks are to be informed that direct communication

with higher authority except through the immediate superior concerned is forbidden.

This order will be brought to the notice of all recruits, and will be published in Unit Orders from time to time. (Effective 27 July, 1940).

is strictly prohibited.

This order is also applicable to civilian workmen, tradesmen or visitors within the meaning of the Camp Area. All persons so disregarding these orders will be prosecuted to (c)

the limit of the law.
Military Police will be held responsible for the observance of (a) this order and are granted the power to search within the camp

area.

12. CIVILIANS

The movement of civilians in and about the Camp Area is forbidden, except on Saturday and Sundays, when camp lines are open to visitors, accompanied by personnel of the Battalion, from 1400 hours to 'Retreat'. Ladies may be admitted to the Camp Area when escorted by personnel of the Battalion between the hours stated above.

13. ARMS AND AMMUNITION

- (a) No fire arms are to be discharged within the camp area.
- (b) No live ammunition of any description is to be in possession of other ranks, except on the range during weapon training, or tactical exercises when blank ammunition is issued. Whenever ammunition of any description is to be used, guns, rifles, and pouches will be examined by an officer before issue and dismissal from parade. All dummy cartridges in possession of other ranks will be examined carefully before any weapon training is carried out. Dummy cartridges are NOT to be carried when live ammunition of any description is to be used.
- (c) Necessary oil, flannelette and pull-throughs for cleaning arms will be provided.
- (d) Any repairs to arms involving stripping or replacement of component parts will be carried out by the R.C.O.C. Armourer. Arms requiring such repairs to be reported to the Weapon Training Officer.
- (e) Coy. and Detail Commanders will ensure that a daily rifle inspection is carried out.
