"Advice has been received from the Canadian Pension Commission that numbers of men drawing disability pensions from the last war have enlisted in the C.A.S.F. and have not notified the Pension Commission of the disposition which they wish made of their pension cheques. All C.E.F. pensioners should at once notify the Canadian Pension Commission, Daly Bldg., Ottawa, which of the following procedures they wish adopted:-

(a) "Pay the pension into a Trust Fund at Head Office where it will draw interest at the current bank rates and be available at any time to the pensioner on his request."

(b) "Pay the pension to the pensioner's wife, or dependent parents, or in the case of orphan children to some person nominated by the pensioner and approved by the Commission who is caring for the children; or,

(c) "Forward the pension cheque to the pensioner at his address with his C.A.S.F. Unit."

"In advising the Pension Commission, pensioner must give his Regtl. Number in the C.E.F., and his Regtl. Number and Unit in the C.A.S.F. Powers of attorney, or assignments of pension cannot be accepted by the Commission"
