Small Yellow Unexploded Bombs

1. The following small H.E. unexploded bombs may be found in large numbers in all areas. Cylindrical, 4 inches long, and $2\frac{1}{2}$ inches in diameter, with a millad collar towards one end. This end has a skeleton bowl shaped cover which forms the firing lever. The whole is painted yellow. These bombs may be found:

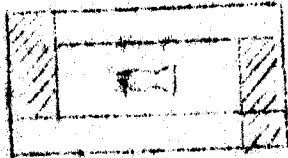
- (a) alone
- (b) attached to a length of wire
- (c) secured to a circular wooden board one foot in diameter

Disposal

These bombs are highly dangerous to touch, disturb, or if the attached wire is pulled.

When they are found in V.D. property it is the duty of the Army to dispose of them. The action to be taken is as follows:-

Units of whatever Arm or Branch of the Service in whose area they are found should immediately surround them with a sandbag enclosure 14 sandbags arranged as sketch:-

The cable if attached should then be cut off 50' from the bomb. R.E. Units provided with demolition equipment will destroy the bomb in situ, in the sandbag enclosure. A 1 oz. dry primer should be sufficient.

Any accessories are to be handed to the intelligence. These may include:-

- (a) Deflated spherical balloon, about 8 feet long in diameter.
- (b) Lengths of thin steel wire.
- (c) Circular boards, one foot in diameter, with a hole in centre, and four cylindrical lugs.
- (d) Spools, 1 foot in diameter, on which wire has been wound.
- (e) Small parachutes, with a spread of 30 inches.
