

FIRE ORDERS:
NEWFOUNDLAND AIRPORT, NFLD.

(Appendix 2)

FOR: 1ST. BN. THE BLACK WATCH (RHR) OF CANADA, C.A.S.F.

"W" FORCE

1. Firemaster: C.S.M. (W.O.II) Buick, J. or the senior W.O.II present.
2. "E" Coy. will supply a fire piquet daily, consisting of 1 Sgt. 1 Cpl. and 20 O.R.s,
3. The Fire Piquet will attend all parades but will not leave the camp except on duty.
4. The tour of duty will run from Reveille to Reveille.
5. Any person discovering a fire will notify the duty bugler at the Guard tent, who will sound the ALARM at short intervals until such a time as all are aroused. On hearing the alarm, all ranks will take it up until all are "STANDING-TO".
6. On the Fire Alarm being sounded the fire piquet will double to the road in front of the Orderly Room and will come under the orders of the Orderly Officer. The Guard Cmmdr. will notify the fire piquet the location of the fire. Employed personnel will parade at their place of employment. If the fire is in the vicinity of documents, records, or stores, no effort, short of risk or injury to personnel will be spared to remove them to a place of safety.
7. On the sounding of the ALARM all Coys., less duties and employed will parade in any dress on the Coy. parade-ground and will await orders from the Senior Officer present or the Orderly Officer.
8. The Firemaster will report the outbreak of the fire to the Orderly Officer and request additional personnel as required.
9. All ranks will be warned that they must take every precaution against starting fires, that in a smoke-filled room there is usually some breathable air near the floor, that if lost in a smoke-filled room, keep your head, think where the exit is, and make for it.
10. The greatest care must be taken to prevent fires while on training parades--lighted matches and cigarettes will not be thrown away at any time.
11. All ranks are warned that the slightest suspicion of a fire must be personally investigated immediately.
12. In each permanent building there will be placed two fire extinguishers. The Firemaster will be responsible that these are inspected regularly and are in proper working order.
13. Drums and buckets for use in case of fire only are conveniently placed near buildings. This equipment is marked "FIRE" and will not be used for any other purposes. Picks, shovels, and axes are available at Q. M. Stores, and may be drawn when necessary to fight bush or other fires.

PIPE BAND STANDING ORDERS: APPENDIX 5.

GENERAL:

All members of the Pipe Band are attached to Headquarters Coy. for accommodation and rations. When disciplinary action is necessary Pipers on strength of Battalion H. Q. will be charged through Battalion H.Q.

DUTIES:

The Band will parade daily on Coy. parades for rifle inspection etc., except when found impracticable when the necessary arrangements will be made with the O.C. or C.S.M. of H.Q. Coy.

At least twice weekly or when called upon to do so the Band will parade with instruments with the Training Coy. and follow instructions of O.C. Training Coy.

Practises will be held and instruments cleaned on the afternoons of Tuesday and Thursday each week unless when otherwise arranged.

'Retreat' will be played by the Band on Friday of each week at the hour set down in Battalion Orders from time to time.

'Reveille' and 'Lights Out' will be played daily by one Piper except on Fridays when the Band will play Reveille.

On the Commanding Officer's parades, the Band will parade immediately 'Markers' has been sounded and will take up a position on the parade ground, on the immediate right of the markers. The Band will then proceed to play 'Fall In' while the Coys. proceed from their lines to their positions on the parade ground.

O.C. of H.Q. Coy. will detail all ranks for any further duties that may be required of them.

DRESS:

On all Battalion, Commanding Officer's, and Training Coy. parades Kilt and Tunic will be worn, together with Steel Helmet, Respirator, Haversack, Water-bottle, and Pouches, except when otherwise instructed. Khaki hose tops will be worn at all times.
