### DAMAGE TO TREES

- Numerous instances have recently been reported of damage by lopping of branches or cutting down young fir trees for camouflage and other purposes. It is appreciated that training in the correct use of amouflage is ecsential, but at the same time, the importance of preserving all available timber is a matter of great national importance.
- In view of the fact that trees are now in loaf, it is considered that camouflage can generally be sufficiently effected by the use of forns, grass, etc., and units are, therefore, directed to ensure that no folling or lopping of trees or shrubs takes place without express authority being first obtained from Aldershot Area H. Q.
- In future, cases where it is proved that specific units are guilty of cutting down or damaging trees for any purpose whatsoever, they will be required to pay the cost of the damage done.

  - (e) any arsenal, factory magazine or store of munitions of war arms, equipment or supplies for any of His Majesty's forces whether completed or in course of construction.

- (f) any wireless, telegraph, telephone signal or cable stations
- (g) any dock caisson dockyard, harbour, shipbuilding works or load in pier.
- (h) any wessel of war either complete or under construction or any vessels or vehicle engaged in the transport of supplies or persons.
- (i) any arcraft or the wreckage of any aircraft.
- (j) any building, structure vessel or other object damaged by enemy action or as a result of steps taken to repel enemy action
- (k) any hospital or station at which casualties whether civil or otherwise are treated; any ambulance or convoy of injured persons or any injured person.
- (1) any electricity gas or water works, or any gasemeter or reservoir or any cil store.
- (m) any assembly of persons for the purpose of transport or evacuation or any temporary camp or other accommodation or transport vehicles used for the purpose of evacuation.
- (n) any riotous or disorderly assembly or premises or other chiect damaged in the course of such assembly.

In future screw pickets will NOT to used for wiring. Where these have already been used the obstacle will be strengthened by the addition of angle or foresty pickets at least every third bay. These will be wiree to the obstacle with additional wire.

### VEHICLES ON THE MOVE - CARRYING OF SCRIE METS.

When vehicles are on the move, scrim nets are to be stored inside the vehicle, it should be noted that when troops are engaged on operations, nets may be carried stretched over the canopy of vehicles to facilitate their rapid adjustment at halts, provided that they are tightly tied down while the vehicles are in movement. When no operations are in progress net will be packed neatly and stored inside the vehicle.

### TIRE PRESSURES - M.T.

As there appears to be some confusion regarding proper tire pressure the following schedule will a ply forthwith to all vehicles (both MGO and QMG) of 5 Cdn IndBd. (OVER)

Inflation pressure of all tires, including spare wheel tires, will be checked weekly or more frequently as necessary, with the pressure gauge provided in the vehicle tool kit, and maintained to the correct pressure.
