2. Scope of the Exercise. The following will take part. (This detail differs slightly from that given in Preliminary Instructions issued under S.E. 600/22/G. dated 18 May to some recipients of these instructions).

X Home Guard. Certain H.G. Units, as detailed in Index No. 4. will take part in the exercise, between 1400 hrs Sat 14 Jun and 1200 hrs Sun 15 Jun only, with "own tps".

Civil. The police in the area of operations of the "British" forces will be warned of the probable course of the exercise, under arrangements to be made by Command H.Q. (G.2. Civil), and will be prepared to take such action as exercise events demand.

Otherwise NO Civil Authorities are participating.

X 3. Co-operation R.A.F. Amongst other aspects of R.A.F. Co-operation the following will be practised by "own tps" only, under orders to be issued by Comds. 4 Corps, Cdn. Corps and 8 Armd. Div in conjunction with A.C. Sqns under command.

X 4. NO Withdrawal. The existing order "There will be NO withdrawal" will apply equally to both own tps and "enemy". Patrols, only, may withdraw. Otherwise, in any local engagement tps will either hold their ground or counter attack until an umpire has assessed the result.

Such tps as are adjudged to be overrun will remove their headdresses remain where they are, and take NO further part in the battle until moved by an Umpire. Such tps will be moved by an Umpire, so as to rejoin their unit or formation, only when this movement can NOT have immediate effect on operations. This movement will be made, in formed bodies, with headdresses removed.

On the completion of such a move, tps will replace headdresses and be considered as re-inforcements.

5. DISTINGUISHING MARKS.

BRITISH. Dress. Tps on BRITISH side will wear normal battle order. All ranks will wear STEEL HELMETS.

Vehicles. No distinguishing marks other than normal Div etc. sign.

ENEMY. Dress. Enemy will wear F.S.Caps and carry steel helmets slung.

Vehicles. A horizontal white chalk band 4" wide will be marked all round all Enemy carriers. Other "Enemy" vehicles which are NOT marked with either 47 Div, 55 Div, 56 Div 25 Army Tank Bde or 24 Gds Bde vehicle marking sign, will have a circular white disc one foot in diameter, in front and rear, in the places in which the Divisional sign would be.

6. Duration of the Exercise.

The exercise will start from 0830 hrs 14 Jun and will end late on 16 Jun.

7. Code Name for the Exercise.

The Exercise will be known and referred to throughout, by the code name "WATERLOO". Should it be necessary to cancel the exercise or to close it prematurely, the code words "NEGATIVE WATERLOO" will be used. They will be used for this purpose only, and not for the closing down of the exercise at its conclusion.

8. ALL MESSAGES AND ORDERS AND ALL TELEPHONE CONVERSATIONS WILL OPEN AND END WITH THE WORD "WATERLOO", WHICH WILL BE SENT IN CLEAR EVEN IN CIPHER MESSAGES. THE WORD "EXERCISE" WILL NOT BE USED AT ANY TIME.

S E C U R I T Y.

9. Copies of Exercise Papers.

(a) All copies of exercise papers will be marked SECRET, and will be serially numbered. Officers will be personally responsible for the security of copies issued to them.

(b) At the conclusion of the exercise all papers will be retained until destruction orders are issued from H.Q. South-Eastern Command.

10. Code Names.

Present, list B training Code Names will be used by own tps.

Blocks of Special, Exercise Waterloo Code Names will be issued by Command H.Q.(G.I.(b)) to Comd."Enemy" for use by all "enemy" units.

11. NO COMPLETE SET OF RULES FOR SECURITY CAN BE ISSUED BUT ALL ARE WARNED AGAINST CASUAL OR LOOSE TALK ON PHONES. THE DANGER OF ALARMING THE CIVIL POPULATION OR OTHERS NOT TAKING PART IN THE EXERCISE MUST BE BORNE IN MIND.

17. Control Conference.

There will be a Control Conference at The Hill Hotel H.Q. South Eastern Command on Sat. 7 Jun 41 at 1030 hrs.

The following will attend:-

All members of the Central Control (Para.12 above).
The Chief Umpire, only, at H.Q. 4 Corps, Cdn.Corps,
8 Armd.Div. and "Enemy" (Para.13 above).

18. Umpires Conferences.

Chief Umpires (para.14 above) will arrange such Conferences as are necessary to instruct all Senior and other umpires in their role.

19. Distinguishing Marks Control & Umpires.

(a) Members of Central Control will wear a blue armband.
Central Control cars will have a pink X affixed to the windscreen.

- (b) Umpires will wear white armbands.
Umpires vehicles will have a white X affixed to the windscreen.

20. Carriers for Umpires. Each Inf.Bn. participating will earmark one of its carriers for use by umpires if required. These carriers will only be withdrawn from the bn on the orders of the Senior Umpire concerned. (para.15).

EXERCISE EXPEDIENTS.

21. Gas.

In order to avoid spreading unintentional alarm, gas if used, will be referred to throughout by the Code Name STINKER, i.e. Gas Spray will therefore be referred to as STINKER SPRAY etc.

22. ROAD BLOCKS.

Road Blocks, made by own tps or enemy will be simulated as follows:-

At each block. (a) A vehicle will, if available, be stationed on the rd. The dvr. will remain with the vehicle, and move it only to allow civilian vehicles to pass, or on orders of an umpire.

- (b) A white flag on a pole will be erected, to which will be affixed a card signed by an umpire, showing
- Materials used.
 - Source of Supply.
 - No. of men used.
 - How long they worked.

Road Blocks so marked will only be removed when an umpire is satisfied that adequate measures have been taken. It is hoped that one Traffic Control Company will be made available to each Own Tps and "Enemy" to assist in marking rd blocks. This will be confirmed in a separate letter.

23. ROAD DAMAGE.

Road Damage will be simulated as for road blocks. The Card, affixed to the flag pole will show:-

- Time rd was damaged.
- What is the damage.
- How long it will take to repair.

The portion of road damaged will only be used when an umpire is satisfied that proper measures have been taken to effect repairs.

24. VEHICLES PUT OUT OF ACTION.

A vehicle put out of action will remain exactly where the incident occurs. The driver will remain with the vehicle and will be handed by an umpire a written note giving particulars of the damage.

The driver will only remove the vehicle:-

- (a) To allow civilian traffic to pass, (after which he will return it).
- (b) To the side of the road, if the vehicle is to be overturned, ditched, or removed by tps participating who, in the opinion of an umpire are adequate in numbers and equipment.

25. A.Tk. mines. A.Tk mines will be simulated in one of two ways:
 Either:-

- (a) A brick with a white X marked on top and sides.
- (b) A.Tk strips (a string of sandbags sewn together).

A.Tk mines will NOT be laid unless an umpire is satisfied that they would, in fact, be available on the spot, and that adequate time and labour is available to lay, arm and fuze them.

26. AMMUNITION AND FIREWORKS.

Service Ammunition.

Active Service Scale ammunition for all weapons will be carried throughout the exercise. *S.A.A. BALL will be carried in 1st line rmt, NOT*
~~For safety reasons, .303 rifle amn carried on the man, will be put in the LEFT hand pouch and tied up.~~ Weapons will NOT be loaded ^{on the man}
 with service ammunition NOR will magazines be fixed other than except. A.A.L.M.G.

28. Blank Ammunition. Use of.

(a) Arty Blank. One round from one gun per troop will be fired to mark the opening round of a timed programme, or the engagement of any target over open sights.

(b) Armoured Formations. 8 Armd.Div and 25 Army Tank Bde. will NOT carry, NOR use, blank amn.

A D M I N I S T R A T I V E.

29. Sups. During the exercise NO adm vehicles may pass through "No Mans land".

30. Accommodation and Rations. Umpires.

Formation and Unit Headquarters, to which umpires, and Neutral Signals personnel are attached, will be responsible for providing their accommodation and rations.

Where this is impossible, a certificate will be obtained from the H.Q. concerned, and Umpire and Neutral Signals personnel will make their own arrangements, claiming detention allowance through the usual channels.

31. Transport Umpires. Formations providing Umpires will also provide them with transport.

F I N A N C I A L.

32. Special Provisions.

Authority is given for the reservation of accommodation as shewn below. It is stressed that in all cases the most economical arrangement be made.

- (a) Visitors. In view of the fact that it is impossible to assess the number of visitors who may attend the exercise it will not be possible to make special arrangements for all. Authority is given, therefore, for visitors, who have necessarily to make their own arrangements, at short notice, to draw detention allowance under para. 354 Allowance Regulations for the first night. ATTENTION IS HOWEVER DRAWN TO A.C.I. 705 of 1940.
- (b) Central Control. One Control room and sleeping accommodation for ten officers may be reserved.
- (c) H.Q. "Enemy". Since it is NOT possible for H.Q. "Enemy" to work from any existing H.Q., authority is given for Comd. 47 Div to hire suitable accommodation.

NO detention allowance is admissible for personnel of H.Q. "Enemy".

- (d) Chief Umpire 4 Corps, Cdn. Corps, 8 Armd. Div. when these H.Q. move are authorised to hire one room in the new locality.
- (e) Neutral Signals. One room may be reserved for each neutral telephone point being established by the C.S.O. in the expected area of operations.

Payment. Bills for (b) & (d) will be approved by G. (Training) H.Q. S.E. Command and passed to the Command Paymaster for adjustment.

The Bill for (c) will be paid by an imprest holder H.Q. 47 Div, and bills for (e) will be paid by an imprest holder to be detailed by C.S.O. The sums will be claimed in current Company Imprest accounts. Full details will be inserted on consolidated A.Fs. P.1922 which, supported by receipts, will be passed to C.P. S.E. Command for adjustment.

33. Repayment for Telephone Calls. Any member of the Control or Umpire Staff requiring to use a phone will pay for his call and be reimbursed as detailed in Allowance Regulations para. 634.

DAMAGE and COMPENSATION.

34. Prevention and repair of damage.

- (a) Notes on prevention of damage are attached at Appendix I.A.
- (b) Each 4 Corps, Cdn. Corps & Armd. Div and "Enemy" will have a previously nominated repair party standing by to make good such damage to fences etc. as can be undertaken on the spot.

- (c) H.Q. of each Formation participating will forward to the Chief Compensation officer 4 Corps as soon as possible after the exercise a statement of any damage known to have been done, giving nature, extent, and map reference.

35. Compensation.

The exercise will take place in the general area HORSHAM
 Q.64 - ASHDOWN FOREST - CROWBOROUGH Q.94 - LEWES Q.82 - NEWHAVEN
 Q.82 - LITTLEHAMPTON Q.42 - PULBOROUGH Q.43.

Chief Compensation Officer 4 Corps will be responsible for all matters of compensation and will make all preliminary arrangements.

INTERCOMMUNICATION.

36. INTERCOMMUNICATION. GENERAL.

ALL GENUINE OPERATIONAL MESSAGES AS OPPOSED TO EXERCISE OPERATIONAL MESSAGES WILL HAVE PRIORITY ON ALL COMMUNICATIONS THROUGHOUT THE EXERCISE. FOR EXAMPLE AN "IMMEDIATE" GENUINE OPERATIONAL MESSAGE WILL TAKE PRECEDENCE OVER AN "IMMEDIATE" EXERCISE MESSAGE, BUT NOT OVER AN "EMERGENCY OPERATIONS" EXERCISE MESSAGE.

APPENDIX 1.A. to Exercise Instructions

Prevention of Damage.

1. In the interests of economy it is essential to avoid damage to farm lands and private property. The following points will be especially observed:--

- (a) Cultivated land should be avoided. When the tactical situation makes this impossible, troops will move along the edges of fields, to avoid the crops as much as possible.
- (b) Gaps should not be made in hedges or fences. When they are unavoidable, the unit concerned will ensure that such gaps are built up again.
- (c) Gates which are opened will be closed again. If a column has to pass through such a gate, a man from the head of the column will be left to close the gate when the tail has passed through.
- (d) Trees and bushes will NOT be cut down for firewood, nor will timber be removed from fences or buildings for this purpose.
- (e) Hay and straw will NOT be removed from ricks, or used for any purpose.
- (f) Particular care will be exercised to see that M.T. and carriers do as little harm as possible to private drives or other unmetalled roads, and to cultivated land, especially during wet weather.
- (g) Troops off duty have no right to enter any park, wood, field or other private property outside the confines of their camp or bivouac.

2. No officer or man will on any account offer any sum in compensation for damage, or express any opinion as to the amount of compensation that should be claimed. Complainants should be referred to the ~~Corps Compensation Officer 4 Corps.~~

Chief COMPENSATION Officer Surrey and Surrey Area

1. The exercise will deal with the first and subsequent days of an invasion of the BRITISH Isles.

(a) Events up to 0830 hrs 14 Jun will be covered by an opening narrative which is issued (Index No.3.)

(b) From 0830 hrs, 14 Jun, the situation will develop in accordance with the actions of own troops and "enemy" supplemented by orders, messages, etc. issued by Control.

2. Separate instructions are issued (Indices 5 and 6) to cover the actions of Controlled Formations and Units, and of Control and Umpire Staffs where necessary.

3. Information.

Information will be provided by control and umpires through the channels set out below. Officers must realize that during active operations information is often scanty and often conflicting and be prepared to treat it accordingly. It can be accepted as a general rule that information in an exercise is far more accurate than it would be in actual war.

4. Information from Naval, Military, R.A.F., and Civil Sources, outside the scope of the exercise will be supplied by control at H.Q.'s participating.

5. All H.Qs and troops receiving exercise information will deal with it as they would in actual operations subject to the instructions laid down in paras 6 and 7 below:

ISSUE OF ORDERS AND MESSAGES.

6. (a) All H.Qs with which a Control Staff or an Umpire is working will ensure that one copy of all written orders and messages, issued or received, is passed to that Control Staff or Umpire. Also that a member of the Control Staff or an Umpire is informed of all messages or orders issued or received verbally or by phone or R/T.

(b) All Liaison Officers or Motor contact officers will be instructed to call on the Control Staff or Umpire both at the H.Q. they are leaving and at the H.Q. they are visiting to explain their mission.

7. (a) All orders and messages that would have been issued by Army H.Q., G.H.Q., War Office (incl Naval and R.A.F. matter), or by Civil Authorities, NOT participating will be issued by Central Control, and by Umpires at ~~other~~ H.Q., who would receive such matter direct.

Messages that would have been addressed to Army H.Q., G.H.Q., War Office, or Civil authorities not participating ~~will similarly be passed to Control~~ *will be passed to Chief UMPIRE who will keep CENTRAL CONTROL informed and will obtain any major decision*

(b) All orders, and messages will be issued as normally between ~~Army H.Q. and~~ Formation and subordinate H.Q. participating. *from CONTROL before replying*

(c) All orders and messages to and from subordinate Formations and units who are NOT participating will be issued to and received from Umpires at the H.Q. concerned.

8. Administration.

Information as to casualties of all natures, including damage to vehicles, supply depots, buildings etc., will be assessed by the umpires and passed in the most realistic manner to the H.Qs. concerned.

9. All orders, indents, and messages in connection with ammunition, supplies, petrol, engineer and ordnance stores, that would in operations be issued by H.Q. participating, will, in fact, be issued, under the same procedure as in para.7.

During the night 13/14 Jun, the GERMANS, began a large scale attack on the BRITISH ISLES, which involved a series of widespread landings on the EAST and SOUTH coasts of this Country, without any previous attempt to obtain air superiority.

In both cases, although the GERMAN parachute troops were attacked, and suffered casualties, they succeeded in their objects before first light 14 Jun.

Fighting on the SOUTH DOWNS is heavy and confused. Between BEACHY HEAD and the RYE Area there does NOT seem to have been any GERMAN air or sea borne landing.

In the RYE Area, the situation is confused, but it is known that the GERMANS have captured RYE HARBOUR, only partially immobilised, and are landing sea borne forces.

at 0830 hrs 14 Jun, the 167th Inf. Bde. is heavily engaged in the WALLAND MARSH Area, EAST of ROYAL MILITARY CANAL.

There is NO report of any operations N.W. of ROYAL MILITARY CANAL. 12 Corps Area.

EXERCISE "WATERLOO"

DECONTAMINATION

1. The following procedure for the exchange and decontamination of clothing and equipment will be adopted:-

(a) Div. will establish clothing point, if possible in the vicinity of Headquarters at which the 2nd line vehicles carrying the reserve clothing and equipment will assemble.

(b) The 8 lorries provided in Pet. Coy. for anti-gas reserves should each carry identical mixed loads.

(c) Delivery from clothing points to units will be by complete lorry loads on receipt of orders from the formation H.Q. concerned.

(d) Delivery points (D.P.'s.) will normally be unit "B" echelons.

(e) After delivering reserve clothing, the lorries will reload at the D.P. with the contaminated clothing and convey it to the mob laundry and decn unit.

(f) At the Mob Laundry & Fwd Decn Unit the lorry after unloading will be cleansed by the driver, reload with clean clothing and equipment and return to the clothing point.

2. Should gas be introduced in "WATERLOO" the above procedure will be modified to the extent that NO actual exchange of clothing will take place. Thus when clothing lorries arrive at D.P.'s., the receiving unit will give the driver a "WATERLOO" receipt for the clothing and equipment but the lorries will not unload. The lorries instead will proceed with their original load to the allotted Mob Laundry & Fwd Decn Unit where they will be unloaded obtaining a "WATERLOO" receipt from the laundry.

3. After decontamination the lorries will reload with their original loads and return to the formation clothing point.

4. To exercise mob laundries, D.D.O.S., Cdn. Corps, will arrange for the delivery to them of a limited amount of part worn clothing for decontamination.

Note: Unit spare clothing & anti gas equipment will NOT be taken.

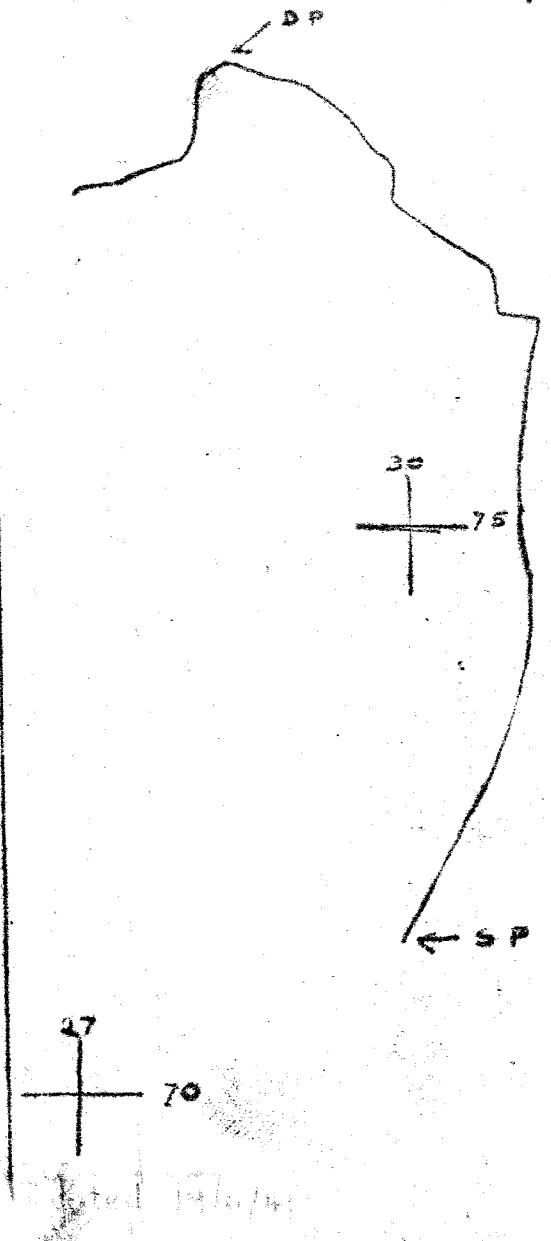
