22 November, 1940.

TO: BN.H.Q., 'HQ', 'A', 'B', 'C', 'D' & 'E' Coys.

SIGHTSEEING TOURS

1. The GOC has granted permission to units under his command to use a certain percentage of the motor transport in order that personnel may proceed on Sightseeing Tours to local points of interest on Sundays.

2. There are many places of both historic and military interest within the vicinity of Aldershot.

3. Tours are being arranged by H/Capt. D.S. Mackay to Winchester, Windsor, Oxford etc. Each of these points will be visited in turn.

4. In order to make this a success the party will be limited to 100 men (including drivers). Each Coy. participating will detail a Warrant Officer or Sergeant, who will be responsible for the men in his Coy. An Officer will be in charge of the

party. It is expected that there will be time in excess of that used for sightseeing which the men may put to their own use.

5. Winchester Cathedral and The Round Table will be visited on 24 Nov. The convey will leave Albuhera Lines at 1300 hrs. Dress to be detailed later.

6. The following is the allocation to the various Coys:-

Bn.H.Q.	=	10
'HQ'	=	30 (including drivers)
'A'	=	25
✓ 'D'	=	25
'E'	=	10

7. Owing to the fact that 'B' and 'C' Coys. will be on duty, men from these Coys. will not be eligible for this trip

8. A report of the number of men who wish to attend should be given to H/Capt. Mackay not later than 1000 hours, Sat. 23 Nov. and a nominal roll of those who have attended these trips will be maintained by the Coys.
