

APPENDIX L.

ORDERS FOR IN-LYING PIQUET.

1. The In-lying Piquet, less sentries and patrols will be available at all times for whatever duty they may be called upon to perform by the Field Officer of the week.
2. (A) Sentries will be posted at all entrances to C.N.E. Barracks area, as marked on the accompanying plan. Sentries will only allow persons or vehicles to enter the area who are in possession of proper passes and car stickers respectively, signed by the D.A.Q.M.G., of M.D. 2. All persons and vehicles not in possession of proper passes wishing to enter the area, will be directed to report at either The Prince's Gate or Dufferin Gate, where they will be dealt with by the N.C.O. on duty.  
  
(B) Patrols will be detailed to patrol all roads and control traffic within the area and maintain touch with sentries at odd intervals.
3. All sentries and patrols will report any unusual occurrence<sup>r/</sup> immediately through the proper channel.
4. Sentries and patrols will be relieved every two hours.
5. No sentry or patrol will leave his post or beat respectively, without being properly relieved.

- (d) Private Cars are not to be parked on Traffic Arteries.
- (e) Each Unit is responsible for the general cleanliness of its training area, and for damage to public property therein.

3. (c) Sundays will be observed as holidays. Church Parades will be held as ordered through Bn. Orders.

4. (i) GARRISON DUTIES:

Duty Units will be as notified in M.D. No. 2 Routine Orders(CASF)

(ii) TOUR OF DUTY

Tour of duty will be from Reveille Monday to Reveille the following Monday.

(iii) DUTIES

The Duty Unit will appoint a Field Officer of the Week. His name will be forwarded to District Headquarters not later than Wednesday in advance of the week for which he will do duty.

The Field Officer of the Week will inspect the In-lying Piquet daily at 0900 hrs.

He will inspect the Barracks Area daily and inform the Unit concerned of any irregularity found.

He will visit all sentries and patrols four times by day and four times by night, after 2300 hrs, during his tour of duty.

He will render a report of the duties he has performed during his tour to District Headquarters by Wednesday following its completion.

He will report any unusual occurrence to District Headquarters immediately. He will visit the station hospital Stanley Barracks and Guard Detention Room daily.

(iv) IN-LYING PIQUET:

The Duty Unit will detail an In-Lying Piquet consisting of:

One Subaltern Officer  
Two Sergeants  
Four Corporals or Lance/Cpls.  
Twenty-four other ranks.

Orders for the In-Lying Piquet are detailed in Appendix 1 to these Standing Orders.

5. BATTALION DUTIES

A Guard will be mounted daily on the Bn. Main Door to the Horse Palace at 0945 hrs.

Guard Report will be prepared and rendered to the Orderly Room daily by 1000 hrs. Charge sheets for all men detained in the Guard Room or detention room will be submitted Coy. Headquarters by 0800 hrs. daily.

The Guard will consist of 1 N.C.O. and 3 O.Rs.

A Piquet, consisting of 1 N.C.O. and 9 O.Rs., will be mounted daily.

Posts:- Desk - main entrance.  
Q.M. Stores.  
Orderly Room runner.

Bn. Orderly Officer will be detailed daily. His tour of duty will commence and end at Reveille. The Bn. Orderly Officers' Reports will be rendered to the Bn. Orderly Room at 1000 hrs. daily.

7. PASSES

Passes to other ranks may be granted in accordance with K.R. (Can.) Para. 1137.

8. CANTEENS

(a) Dry Canteens will NOT be opened during the following hours:

Sundays -	1000 to 1200 hours. after 2130 hours.
Saturdays -	0830 to 1200 hours. after 2130 hrs.
Other Days /	0830 to 1200 hours. 1330 to 1630 hours. after 2130 hours.

(b) Beer and Wine will only be sold in the Wet Canteen between the following hours:

Sundays - 2000 to 2130 hours. Other Days 1200 to 1300 hours.  
1830 to 2130 hours.

9. LIQUOR IN BARRACKS:

- (a) The sale of beer in Messes and Canteens to civilians is forbidden under the Ontario Liquor Control Act.
- (b) No Officer or soldier shall bring into barracks, for his personal consumption, any wine spirituous or malt liquor.

10. DISCIPLINE

(a) Saluting

All ranks are warned of the necessity of paying proper compliments at all times.

(b) Dress

All ranks leaving barracks must be properly dressed.  
All ranks will wear uniform at all times.

(c) Traffic

- (i) The speed of motor vehicles of all types within the C.N.E. Barracks Area will not exceed 20 M.P.H.
- (ii) All traffic of motor vehicles must be strictly confined to roads.

(d) Parking

All motor vehicles must be parked in areas allotted to units.

(e) Private Property

All ranks are forbidden to trespass on Private Property.  
Climbing over fences bordering the Barracks area is strictly forbidden.

- (f) All ranks are warned that, on no account will they interfere with the Electric Wiring, either inside or outside buildings in the C.N.E. Barracks. In the event of any failure of current requisition for repairs must be submitted through the proper channels.

11. PRECAUTIONS AGAINST FIRE

- (a) Attention is drawn to "FIRE ORDERS" (Appendix 2) attached to these orders.

12. AMMUNITION

No firing of live ammunition is to take place within the C.N.E. Barracks area.

13. INSPECTION OF ARMS AND AMMUNITION

- (a) On every occasion when troops parade with rifles, each rifle must be inspected, not only with a view to ascertaining its cleanliness, but also to ascertain that no live or blank ammunition is in the barrel or magazine.
- (b) On all occasions when blank ammunition is to be used by troops, not only will the inspection of arms be carried out in accordance with (a) above, but the pockets, pouches and bandoliers of all men will be examined to ascertain that they are not in possession of any ball or dummy ammunition. All blank ammunition issued will be carefully inspected in order to ascertain that there are no ball or dummy cartridges mixed with the blank ammunition. This inspection will be carried out before the commencement of, and at the conclusion of, these parades. All remaining blank cartridges will be collected and turned into stores after each parade.
- (c) Similarly, before men are dismissed from any parade for which ball ammunition has been issued, an officer or warrant officer will ascertain that none remains in their rifles, pouches, magazines or bandoliers. After firing with ball ammunition a certificate will be rendered to District Headquarters that all unexpended rounds of ball ammunition have been collected or otherwise accounted for. (K.R.(Cn.) para. 1315 (a) ).

14. MAIL AND TELEGRAMS

- (a) Times of closing of out-going mails, and when in-coming mail will be available for distribution will be published in Routine Orders.
- (b) Units will detail one man to deliver and collect unit mail, daily, from the Post Officer established at the Headquarters C.N.E. Barracks. The tour of duty for this man should not be less than one week. He must be given a written authority signed by the Commanding Officer to receive the Units mail.

15. GUARD DETENTION ROOM

The Guard Detention Room is situated in the East Block of Stanley Barracks.

16. CIVILIANS

No civilians will be permitted in the Barracks except on authority of the Adjutant or the R.S.M. Women will not be allowed in the Barracks at any time.

17. SERGEANTS' MESS

Sergeants' Mess will be closed at 2300 hrs. daily.

18. RADIOS

Application to install privately owned radios in Barrack Rooms will be made by individuals to the Commanding Officer, through the proper channels.

19. LIGHT AND WATER

Every effort must be made by all ranks to conserve the supply of water and electricity. Taps must not be left running unnecessarily not lights left burning.

20. MILITARY POLICE

Military Police in charge of Lieut. L.T. Hargreaves, R.R. of C. will be recognized by arm bands with the letters M.P. thereon.

Military Police Headquarters are located at the City Police Garage, Strachan Ave., Telephone Number (Delaide) 6556.

Duties:- They will work in close conjunction with the Police Department of the City of Toronto, and will strictly adhere to the spirit and letter of instructions given them by the Officer in charge of Military Police. Military Police will check the appearance and conduct of all soldiers appearing in public. In cases where men are discovered in the public streets improperly dressed, their name, Regimental number and Regiment will be taken and reported to their Units, stating the cause of report.

21. FIRE

The Guard and the Piquet will parade at the main door of the barracks in case of fire and will come under the Orderly Officer or the Bn. Orderly Sergeant.

22. ALARM

In the event of the Alarm the Coys. will fall-in on the Coy. Parade Grounds. The Orderly Officer will report to the senior Officer present, who will take charge of the parade.

23. Sanitation

- (a) Rubbish and cigarette butts will not be thrown on the floors but will be placed in receptacles provided.
- (b) Refuse of any kind will not be thrown in the urinals or lavatories.
- (c) A sanitary fatigue will be detailed daily under the Bn. Orderly Sergeant.

24. GUARD STORES

A list of all stores and equipment on charge to the Guard will be kept in the Guard Room. This list will be checked by each successive Guard, Sergeant, who will ensure that the articles on charge are correct as to number and in good condition.

8. LEAVE OF ABSENCE

(1) All requests for leave of absence, prepared by Coy. Orderly Cpl. must be submitted for recommendation to the Company Commander or in the case of Bn.H.Q. to the I.O. After recommendation, passes will be submitted to Bn. Orderly Room, by 1400 hrs. on the day previous and in the case of week-end leave passes must reach Bn. Orderly Room by 1600 hrs. Thursday, before being granted.

(2) Leave Duty Officer: Duty Officer will not leave the Station during his tour of duty without written permission of the Adjutant and the name of the substitute must be submitted in the written permission.

9. Roll Calls

Under the N.C.O. i/c Piquet, the Coy. Orderly Sgts. (Caron Bldg.) will call the roll of men sleeping in Caron Building at Last Post and at Reveille. Any absentees will be entered on the Tatoo Report and Absence Report respectively. The Tatoo and Absence Reports will be handed to the B.O.S. for distribution to the Coys. for action by 0800 hrs. the following day.

10. Visitors will not be permitted inside the Station except as guests of the Officers' or Sergeants' Mess.

11. Fire

The Guard will parade on the main floor of the Armoury in the case of fire and will come under the orders of the Orderly Officer.

12. Alarm

In the event of an alarm the Bn. will fall in on the Bn. Parade Ground. The Orderly Officer will report to the senior officer present who will take charge of the parade.

13. Discipline

(a) All ranks are forbidden to mark or deface any property moveable or unmoveable within the Armoury or Barrack Quarters.

(b) At all parades when rifles are issued the senior officer or N.C.O. present is responsible that the arms are inspected.

(c) All ranks to be properly dressed when on duty.

14. Sick

Other Ranks reporting sick must attend sick parade as laid down. The practice of telephoning from home must cease except in cases of extreme necessity. Failure to comply with this order will result in disciplinary action.

Motor vehicles exceeding speed limits
