CANTLIE CIRCUS, CARNEGIE CIRCUS -- and FRASER BRIDGE. --

In our travels through France and Belgium we have remarked with what great respect the peoples of these countries rever our dead of the last war, and the immaculate condition in which they have preserved the memorials which a grateful Canada caused to be erected to their immortal memory.

The people of France have once again in this war paid a very high tribute to three officers whom we of the regiment came to know, respect and admire.

On the outskirts of FLEURY-sur-ORNE, which is rapidly being rebuilt, is a large intersection. When this is finally completed the circus thus formed will be named "CANTLIE CIRCUS," in honour of our late Colonel, Lt. Col. S.S.T.Cantlie, who was fatally wounded just outside the town.

Nearby will be another circus, this one named "CARNEGIE CIRCUS" after the late Maj. J. Carnegie, Bde.Maj. of the 6th.Bde., and formerly Adjutant of the BLACK WATCH.

Somewhere on the way between ABBEVILLE and LILLE the roadway runs over a bridge bearing the name "FRASER BRIDGE", presumably after the late Maj. George Fraser, O.C. of D.Company of the Watch.
